TITLE: Hardship Funding Programme

Background and Key Issues:

Background

- 1. It was agreed by Council in September 2022 to develop a Hardship Funding Programme. This is to support constituted/legally governed community and voluntary /not for profit organisations to address hardship due to the current cost of living crisis, particularly the increase in energy and food costs. There is an overall allocation of £100k available.
- The Hardship Funding Programme is developed in recognition of the difficult financial circumstances which currently exist in the community and voluntary sector, especially in respect of covering basic overheads which have increased substantially in cost.
- This fund aims to assist local grass roots groups to:
- keep their community buildings operational for existing services;
- provide additionality in programming for local groups/individuals who are facing hardship;
- enhance service delivery by keeping facilities open and possibly longer during the autumn/winter months;
- provide sustenance and resources for users; and/or
- develop or enhance a community planting scheme for materials to grow and supply perishable goods to their community.

Key Issues

- 4. The Fund is open to community/voluntary organisations based in the Lisburn & Castlereagh City Council area that meet the following criteria:
- an open and accountable governing document (Constitution or Articles and Memorandum of Association, or applicable governing document) that has been properly adopted;
- a bank account in the name of the organisation, which requires at least two (unrelated) signatories
- an annual set of independently examined financial accounts, endorsed at an Annual General Meeting;
- a Management Committee or Governing Board, elected by its membership at an Annual General Meeting, and elected office bearers;
- 5. Under the Hardship Funding Programme, applicants can apply for up to a maximum of £2,000 to address any of the key aims set out in paragraph 3 of this paper.

What we will fund:

- 6. Types of areas we can fund include (but not restricted to):
- Energy costs (e.g. heating and lighting)
- Development and/or expansion of services, programmes or activities to address community needs who are facing hardship e.g. people experiencing increased stress/isolation, vulnerable groups
- Costs associated with the provision of food to provide users/those facing hardship with sustenance
- Costs associated with resources deemed applicable to tackling hardship
- Equipment purchases to enable community planting programme delivery e.g. gardening equipment, raised beds, poly tunnel etc.
- Seeds and plants required to grow your own vegetables/herbs or other items which will provide local communities with produce to assist in meal preparation

What we will not fund:

- 7. Types of areas we will not fund include (but not restricted to):
- Individual people
- Private businesses / commercial /statutory /regional sector organisations.
- General building or maintenance costs
- Projects/services operating outside of Lisburn & Castlereagh area
- 8. The financial support available through this grant may not cover all costs associated with the requirements of the group for the development of a particular project. Where this is the case, the criteria will require the organisation to cover any shortfall from their existing

- resources and provide proof of funds. Match funding will not be a pre-requisite for the submission of applications.
- 9. By providing a contribution to the additional running (e.g. energy) costs for a building, it must be used to deliver broad based community programming for the benefit of the local community. The building may be used by a geographic based community or community interest group with members from across the entire City and district.
- 10. Proposals can include costs associated in adapting the delivery of, or creating new programmes, services and activities to help address hardship in local communities.
- 11. In respect of those applicants who wish to develop a Community Planting Scheme, this will also involve training from our Parks staff for groups and members of the public whilst linking groups to key partner organisations to look at meal planning and food waste.
- 12. It is anticipated that the Fund will open at the end of October and close for applications mid-November. This will enable successful applicants to avail of the funding in the weeks prior to Christmas.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the details and eligibility criteria for the Hardship Funding Programme are agreed and the scheme launches following ratification by Council at the end of October.

TITLE:

Pilot DEA Investment Programme 2022/23 - DIY Community Fund Outcome of Assessment

Background and Key Issues:

Background

- Details of the DEA Investment Programme DIY Community Fund were agreed by this
 committee in June 2022. There is an allocation of £30k to support the refresh,
 refurbishment or general improvement to existing community facilities. The fund is to
 enable groups and organisations to improve income opportunities and make the facility
 more user friendly to further engage the local community.
- 2. The Fund opened on the 26 July 2022 and closed for receipt of applications on 5 September 2022. There was a maximum of £1,000 available per application.

Outcome of assessments

- 3. There were a total of 51 applications received with the majority requesting the full amount of £1k. The total amount requested was £49,222.
- 4. 48 applications were deemed eligible and following assessment, in line with the weighted score, the amount requested totalled £40,177.

Options for consideration

- 5. Given the level of interest in this grant programme and its oversubscription, it is necessary to revert to consider options which not only align with the budget available but also avail of underspend in the overall DEA Investment Programme. Therefore consideration is given to three options:
- Option 1: based on the weighted score following assessment, award all 48 groups the
 amount deemed eligible totalling £40,177. This would require an additional contribution of
 £10,177 from anticipated underspend in the DEA Investment Programme 2022/23;
- Option 2: ranking from highest to lowest for all eligible groups, award funding based on weighted score until the £30k is expended. Implementing this option would mean 33 groups would receive the full amount based on their weighted score (£29,445). However 15 groups who were deemed eligible and met the required threshold would not receive funding.
- **Option 3:** reduce the amount available to all 48 eligible groups by 25.5% in order to remain within the £30k budget available for this programme (£29,932).

Recommendation:

It is recommended that

- the content of the paper and associated appendix detailing the outcome of the assessment process is noted;
- Option 1 is agreed with an additional allocation of £10,177 allocated from anticipated DEA Investment Programme 2022/23 underspend;
- support is offered to those applicants who did not meet the threshold/deemed ineligible to source alternative funding opportunities.

Finance and Resource Implications

Option 1: £40,177 from the DEA Investment Programme 2022/23 which includes an additional £10,177 from underspend in the overall programme.

Option 2: £29,445 from the DEA Investment Programme 2022/23 which is £555 under budget. **Option 3**: £29,932 from the DEA Investment Programme 2022/23 which is £68 under budget.

Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic the CLCGB UK had to repeatedly postpone, and eventually cancel, a Royal Review marking the Brigade's 130th Anniversary, scheduled to take place at the National War Memorial Arboretum. Obviously, everyone was understanding but nevertheless, very disappointed. The last time the CLCGB had a Royal Event was in 1994, when Her Majesty the Queen visited the Brigade's NHQ in South Yorkshire. What a great occasion that was.

Due to this, the CLCGB NI will be organising its own Review sometime between June and September 2023, which will mark the CLCGB NI's 130th Anniversary. We wish to make this an event which will give our organisation a boost as we rebuild after the Pandemic. An all-day event is being planned with a Drumhead Service and Review, Games and Picnic in the afternoon, and a Disco Party in the evening. We are planning the event for between 500 and 600 members.

<u>I am writing to ask if it is possible to use Wallace Park for this event.</u> It would give our organisation a significant lift after the last couple of difficult years. The end of May or June 2023, or the end of August, beginning of September 2023 would be suitable but the CLCGB NI can be flexible with dates.

I have written to the Antrim Lieutenancy and the Protocols Dept. at Stormont to see if it can be turned into a Royal Review, therefore the need to be flexible at this time. If it is not to be a Royal event, I believe September 2023 is the most likely time.

As the Brigade was given the Freedom of the Borough, I am hopeful that the Council will grant this request. Thank you for reading this request.

TITLE: Pilot DEA Investment Programme 2022/23 – Keep the Ball Rolling.

Background and Key Issues:

- 1. In May 2022, Members approved the launch of the Sports Club Fund, 'Keep the Ball Rolling'. This fund was approved in February 2022 as part of the Pilot DEA Investment Programme 2022-23, with an associated budget of £100,000.
- 2. The programme was launched and advertised in June, resulting in 47 applications being received. A panel consisting of Officers, met and scored the applications of which 3 were deemed ineligible as set out in Appendix 1.
- 3. The budget for the fund was £100,000 and all successful applications received their allocated award on the basis of the overall % score against the eligible amount applied for.
- 4. This has resulted in a shortfall of £2,425.28 to accommodate all successful applications at the scored amount. With Members approval it is proposed to fund the remaining amount from in year Sports Services budget

Recommendation:

- 1. It is recommended members note the 2022/23 Keep the Ball Rolling DEA Sports Awards
- 2. It is recommended that all 44 eligible groups receive funding as outlined and Members approve the £2,425.28 shortfall being sourced from Sports Services 2022/23 revenue budgets
- 3. It is recommended that the unsuccessful groups receive feedback and support for future applications
