Funding is available for costs associated with the refresh, refurbish or make general improvements to existing community facilities and/or commission professional/technical assistance for those organisations who meet the eligibility criteria. The criterion for the funding ensures that community groups in rural areas are equally likely to be eligible and that the type of improvements the funding is targeting may particularly benefit people in rural areas who rely more on local community facilities because of their proximity and the relative inaccessibility of provision in urban centres.
